As always, I am so very fascinated by Elizabeth Gaskell's writing. I definitely enjoyed this -- funny, witty, full of hilariously vivid old ladies with 19th century idiosyncrasies -- but the main story in CRANFORD just wasn't quite enough of a plot to bump it up to four stars. Liked it a lot, didn't feel quite finished. This all being said So this volume is technically three in one.

The women are terrible gossips and prone to hysteria. At the heart of this story of the new doctor's arrival in a small town, his troubles and his friendships with the local inhabitants, his falling for a local girl and his accidentally attracting the attentions of other town ladies who do not interest him, is a simple social romance with little to make it particularly memorable. It also tends to go off on tangents, one of which took up a good portion of the book.
